1. Executive Summary

1.1 About the Network

The Research Network for Latin America *Ethnicity*, *Citizenship*, *Belonging* is an association of historical, anthropological, cultural studies and sociological institutions of the Universities of Cologne, Bonn, Bielefeld, Münster and Hanover. Within the context of interdisciplinary cooperations, scholars of humanities, social sciences and area studies employ the concepts of *ethnicity*, *citizenship* and *belonging* to scientifically describe the historically specific and context-dependent forms of symbolic boundaries, ideas of order and *belonging* in various regions of Latin America and under circumstances of transnational migration.

1.2 Objectives

The three key concepts of the Research Network address central issues of social inclusion and exclusion worldwide. Research on these issues is conducted nationally and internationally in the areas of political and economic science, sociology and anthropology as well as in history, cultural sciences and linguistics. However, interdisciplinary exchange has been rather limited, primarily due to the lack of institutional platforms and networks for scientific dialogue on research on Latin America. One aim of the Research Network for Latin America is to overcome this institutional deficit, to concentrate the existing expertise on Latin America and to structurally consolidate this expertise.

In 2010-2014 the objective of this interdisciplinary network was the structural reinforcement and extension of the institutional framework of research on Latin America in the field of area studies and the cooperative development of innovative methodological and theoretical approaches. The research has been internationally implemented through regular meetings and workshops, and is made accessible to the scientific community through a number of publications.

In 2014-2016 the focus is on the practical implementation of the key concepts in socio-political contexts and application of the results to practical experiences and problems. We have been investigating in which way the socio-scientific concepts of *ethnicity* and *belonging* are used in socio-political and educational practices and what the consequences are. Further focuses are on how essentialisms are constructed, how policies of identity are used, how *citizenship* is articulated, claimed and emplaced and how mechanisms of inclusion and exclusion are created or reinforced.

This regional expert network is a competent contact institution for local and foreign academics, development cooperation institutions, politicians and the public in general, offering access to differentiated expertise in historical and current controversial conflicts in Latin American development cooperation, politics, economy and culture.

1.3 Key Concepts

Ethnicity describes a socially constructed phenomenon, in which collective self-attributions and attributions by others are employed in delimitation to one another. The actors use different cultural practices or recur to different features to consciously distinguish themselves from others. It is a dynamic concept that is used to classify people into categories. One of the most important reference points in the different semantics of the ethnic is the idea of a common origin (similar to M. Weber).

In the past as well as in present Latin American societies, socio-economic inequality is not only influenced by such ethnic categorizations, but co-determines them significantly. Since the time of colonial rule, ethnic categorization (the sistema de castas) was one of the most important mechanisms of social order. In many regions the Spaniards separated the indigenous inhabitants spatially and socially from the rest of the population. The structures set up by the Spaniards, which shaped Latin American societies over the span of more than three centuries, continued to live on in many places even after the colonial rule fell and still influences the social formations of many states. At the same time, political participation rights are - at least since the colonial period - implicitly organized along ethnic categories. Thus, in Latin America they represent an important resource that can be used by different actors, such as indigenous movements, to obtain their goals. The attempt to invalidate (post-) colonial economic and political exclusion along this category, in turn, reinforces the ethnicization of politics, which led some Latin American societies, such as Colombia, Ecuador and Bolivia, in recent times, to define themselves explicitly as "multi-ethnic". Since the 19th century, a "scientific" concept of race was used to distinguish population groups in Latin America. However, unlike in the U.S., the positive impact of mixing the supposed "races" as a counter-concept to their strict separation was propagated as well (e.g. "la raza cosmica" by J. Vasconcelos in Mexico). Nevertheless, the populations of African and indigenous descendants were often regarded as inferior by the Creole-mestizo elites — excluding them from citizenship in whole or in part. The argument of ethnic belonging, which has been increasingly promoted by indigenous movements since the 1970s, remains central to questions of political, social and cultural participation.

Regarding to configurations of *citizenship*, the Research Network explores the debates about political concepts of order and their changes. It particularly analyses the refor-

mulations of the political commonwealth that occurred repeatedly along Latin American history. This concept describes a historically specific set of civil, political and social rights and obligations (T.H. Marshall). Meanwhile, the triad has been supplemented by cultural rights and obligations of various kinds. At the same time, *citizenship* denominates the constant negotiation process about this set of rights and obligations between political institutions with hegemonial claims, individuals and groups.

Citizenship is thus a dynamic concept: both the rights and obligations that it entails, and the question of who benefits to what extent from civic inclusion (even beyond the formal legal status) were and are subject to ongoing changes. These negotiations refer to an understanding of the state, primarily of European-Republican provenance, which formally bestows all citizens as individuals the same rights and duties and thus establishes membership to a political community, excluding non-citizens. These rights and obligations are based on specific imaginaries of community, as well as the respective basic principles of social inclusion. De facto, the access to those rights in different (historical) phases has not been the same from individuals and groups; it has rather been an expression of different positions of power. Even the newly gained sovereignty, achieved through the independence struggles in the early 19th century, could not bring about fundamental changes. The liberal promise, for example, of formally equal citizenship rights for all "citizens" obscures existing asymmetric power relations. Civil rights can thus establish loyalty to an "imagined community" (B. Anderson) and strengthen social cohesion. Since the establishment of national states in Latin America, these different constructions of the respective national identity groups favor specific social groups and discriminate others. The extension of civil rights onto members of other groups, for example ethnic groups, is subject to constant negotiation processes. The post-/or trans-national understanding of citizenship as well as recent claims concerning ethnic or cultural citizenship debunk the concept of uniform membership as an unfulfilled promise, while undermining it at the same time by looking for alternatives to a state-centered model of citizenship. It is evident that especially indigenous actors and movements actively contribute their own ideas of societal order to the political discourse (ciudadanía indígena, cultural citizenship).

Migration research, too, employs an extended definition of *citizenship*, which emanates from quotidian living patterns, political initiatives and negotiation processes of those who are excluded from possibilities of political participation (e.g. voting) for being so-called non-citizens. Hereby, spatial boundary-marking and reference points, such as nations and continents, are transcended to promote the study of transregional and transnational activities, which dominate the social interactions in a globalised world.

Ideas and understandings of *belonging* vary both in everyday and scientific use. A first scientific reading of the concept implies forms of *belonging* that are used as self or external attribution, as a desire or claim to belong. As such, *belonging* is used as a kind of meta-concept, which involves other social categorisations, such as *citizenship* or *ethnicity*. These formal or otherwise legitimate memberships also constitute an affiliation (*belonging*) with a group. It is then possible to infer from these collective *belongings* processes of inclusion and exclusion related to groups, no matter if they are socially constructed or legally assigned, such as a nationality. It can also be investigated how power relations contribute to the definition of social boundaries or political units that impede *belonging* and thus lead to exclusion ("*politics of belonging*").

This contrasts with the understanding of *belonging* that derives from the bonding of individuals to their natural and social environment. This understanding of *belonging* stresses multiple and convertible bonds beyond normative conceptions of order. These situational and multiple bonds, which may be of social, material and sensual nature, are subjected to a continuous process of change and are constantly re-articulated and re-negotiated in the day-to-day activities and experiences of the actors. In such a reading, *belonging* overrides any form of legal legitimacy and regulation, and comes into being as a result of events and through individual life stories. Especially in times of global networks and constant exchange, the concept indicates the compatibility of different conceptions of *belonging* and thus stresses the permeability and not the establishment of social boundaries. In addition, this understanding of *belonging* as being relational and contextual opens up the possibility to go beyond the analysis of social phenomena and to integrate both the related spatial and historical dimensions.

This can be observed especially in the context of researching transnational movements, migration and trans-locality. In this context, *belonging* reflects the complex relationships that individuals have with different locations, multiple realities and changing social and political landscapes. According to Anthias, *belonging* can be placed at the interface between the social position that is assigned to an individual as part of the social order, and its own positioning within society. The combination of structural and actor-oriented migration research is a promising starting point to work out the tension between the rather essentialist positions of *belonging*, such as the primordial idea of *belonging* to an ethnic group or nation, and ideas of multiple bonds that take into account the alteration and the breakup of normative social orders.

1.4 The Five Sub-proyects


The sub-projects of the Research Network – in spite of their specific focus – are unified by the analysis of social and cultural differences and affiliation criteria, their etiology, mechanisms and consequences. The involved social inclusion and exclusion processes are influenced by a variety of factors. The working groups deal with these various factors in five sub-projects.

In 2010-2014 the sub-project Bielefeld raised the question how inclusion and exclusion are communicated in the political arena and which factors have an impact on this communication. The sub-project Bonn dealt with the political and social space by means of the example of migration and translocal relations. Through the application of a relational and procedural concept of space, this sub-project examined the importance of local-material bonds for the self-conception of migrants, and dealt with how externalities of migrant workers might amplify *citizenship* in a labour market that is increasingly uncertain and marginalized. The sub-project Cologne examined the interdependencies of *ethnicity* and *citizenship* with other social categorizations such as class, gender and age. The sub-project Hanover analysed ethnic attributions in their interaction with socio-economic and political changes. The sub-project Münster examined the historical development of *citizenship* for the population of indigenous and African origins in Mexico during the transition from colonial times to the modern constitutional state.

In 2014-2016 the aim of the sub-project Bielefeld is to develop educational material based on the key concepts of the Research Network in accordance with the principles of Global Education. The sub-project Bonn focuses on articulations of belonging and citizenship in the context of migration in Madrid and examines self-organised social movements and migrant associations. In concepts of the practically applied component, several workshops with migrant organisations and institutions of development cooperation have been organized. Creation processes of cultural differences as well as negotiations of citizenship and belonging in Latin America are at the centre of research interests of the sub-projects Hanover and Cologne. Both sub-projects also work together on an event on Global Education and Intercultural Coaching to transfer the scientific knowledge into practical application. Moreover, the sub-project Cologne is particularly dedicated to the question of what role differentiated citizenship plays in the form of differentiated rights in education in ethnicized conflicts in the conservation unit RESEX in the Brazilian Amazon region. In Hanover, a further focus lies on processes of the formation of elites and the marriage market in the context of migration processes in Ecuadorian urban spaces. The sub-project Münster analyses the creation and use of ethnic and national categories of identity in Mexico at the local level. Another aim of this project is to produce radio features on the results of the Network's researchers.

1.5 Structure of the Research Networt

The Research Network for Latin America consists of three institutions: the research pool, the directorate and the coordination office.

The research pool consists of the following institutions, directors and researchers: Prof. Dr. Nikolai Grube is the director of the sub-project Bonn at the Interdisciplinary Latin America Center (ILZ), University of Bonn. At the Cologne Latin America Centre (CLAC), the sub-project is directed by Prof. Dr. Barbara Potthast from the Department of Iberian and Latin American History, University of Cologne. The sub-project Bielefeld at the Center for Inter-American Studies (CIAS), University of Bielefeld, is headed by Prof. Dr. Olaf Kaltmeier. Prof. Dr. Silke Hensel of the Department of Modern and Contemporary History with special reference to Non-European History directs the sub-project at the University of Münster and Prof. Dr. Wolfgang Gabbert of the Department of Sociology the sub-project at the University of Hanover. These five professors also form the directorate of the Research Network. In 2010-2014 at least one PhD student was assigned to each of these five associates, and one post-doc was assigned to the three institutional members (Bielefeld, Bonn and Cologne). In 2014-2016 one post-doc is assigned to each sub-project.

The coordination office is responsible for the organisation and coordination of the content of the Research Network, it represents the Research Network, it is responsible for organisational processes and collaborates closely with the members of the research pool,

e.g. in the planning and execution of regular work meetings. It consists of managing director Bea Wittger and an assistant. Additionally, in the first two years the Faculty of Arts of the University of Cologne funded a position of a further research associate.

The project staff, i.e. the research pool and the coordination office, meets regularly to discuss their specific research, to coordinate a joint approach and comment on interim results and problems. To ensure an active exchange between the working groups, in 2010-2014 the staff organised four annual symposia, several workshops and summer schools. In alternate years, each working group was responsible for the preparation of the symposium with regards to content and one of the three participating institutions is the host. In addition, in the fourth year, the symposium took place in Guadalajara, Mexico. In 2014-2016 various workshops will be organised by the respective sub-projects in order to maintain and foster a further scientific and non-scientific exchange. Besides the permanent members of the research pool, there are collaborations with other institutions and individuals. One important objective in particular is to integrate scientists from Latin America.

1.6 Funding

The German Federal Ministry of Education and Research (German abbreviation BMBF) sponsors the Research Network for Latin America in the framework of the initiative "Freedom for Research in the Humanities" in the funding priority "Strengthening and advancing Area Studies". It aims to introduce "new forms of cooperation to pool, develop and test specialist competences in the field of area studies more effectively. At the same time, many steps are to be taken to promote subject-specific, interdisciplinary issues and cooperation with the systematic disciplines. Networked, interdisciplinary sites of expertise are to be established in Germany. These will provide a stimulus in this field of humanistic knowledge, not least by cooperating closely with foreign researchers."

2. Research and Proyects



2.1 Sub-project Bielefeld: Ethnicity and Global Education as Subjects of School Teaching

The aim of the sub-project Bielefeld in **2014-2016** is to develop educational material based on the research results on ethnicities in pluricultural societies in Latin America. The expertise of the Research Network is used to support school teachers with their class preparation by providing well-founded material that has been proven in practice. Besides the focus on *ethnicity*, the issues will be concerned with multicultural societies, migration processes, intercultural learning and colonialism, using the Americas as a frame of reference. Based on the pedagogic principles of Global Education, the material offers teachers the possibility to catch up on the latest research results as well as on the historically developed backgrounds of these topics.

The main focus in **2010-2014** was the analysis of ethnically charged discourses and how these discourses are turned into subjects of concepts of social order as well as how the conflicts in the political arena are shaped by the elected forms of representation in this context. Based on a broad comprehension of policy ethnic semantics – their political and cultural representation as well as how they are charged and instrumentalised – were examined by means of the three categories *ethnicity*, *citizenship* and *belonging* in the context of socio-political processes of negotiation in colonial as well as in post-colonial times.

2.2 Sub-proyect Bonn: Collective Articulation of Citizenship in Madrid

In 2014-2016 the sub-project Bonn investigates activations of *citizenship* and *belonging* in the context of migration in Madrid. Since the crisis of 2008, the social positionalities of migrants, migrant organisations and self-organised groups have come under additional stress, interfering with practices and ontologies of becoming (citizen) and articulations of claims. The social movement of the indignad@s of 2011 powerfully emplaced *citizenship* by rhizomatic ways of constructing and amplifying a networked social movement for 'real democracy'. Some migrant organisations joined the movement, using this collective level to articulate politics of difference with respect to their citizenry, while they also focus on empowerment, assistance and social support. In terms of the practically applied component of the second project phase, several workshops with migrant organisations and institutions of development cooperation are organised. Presentations by activists, practitioners and scientists shall enable a debate on the concepts.

In **2010-2014** the research focus has been on transnational migration regarding the concepts of ethnicity, citizenship and belonging. Belonging was assumed to be socially constructed and imagined so that it could be tied up to the idea of relational and multiple attachments of individual actors and underlying concepts of space, breaking a dichotomic understanding of inclusion and exclusion. Citizenship, understood as everyday practices, ontological ways of being and becoming as well as political claim-making, considers how acts of migrants, articulated from a position of difference and externality, come back into the minds of all residents and of societies' representational systems. Thereby, the migrants' "act" of crossing space redefines and animates it, translocalising perceptions of space and places as socio-material hybrids.

2.3 Sub-project of Cologne: Negotiation of Belonging and Citizenship in Consideration of Social Categorisations

In **2014-2016** the sub-project Cologne investigates the connections between *differentiated citizenship* and *ethnicity*. The analysis of interdependencies of social categorisations receives special attention, particularly with regard to *ethnicity* and class. The question is how *differentiated citizenship* in the form of differentiated rights in education reinforces (re)ethnicization and generates new forms of *belonging* and which kind of consequences this has in conflictive situations. Specifically, this is examined in the Conservation Unit *Reserva Extrativistas Tapajos-Arapiuns* (RESEX) in the Brazilian Amazon region.

Besides this research, the sub-project Cologne cooperates with the sub-project Bielefeld on the development of educational material for Global Education with contributions on Brazil and works together with the sub-project Hanover on the sensitisation of trainers for an anti-racist and postcolonial perspective on Global Education and Intercultural Coaching.

In **2010-2014** the sub-project Cologne investigated the interdependencies of social categorisations, such as *ethnicity*, class, gender, religion, age, place of origin etc. as mechanisms of inclusion and exclusion and their everyday consequences. Moreover, it has been tested if and how concepts of *citizenship* and *belonging* can be used to analyse the multilayered inclusions and exclusions.

2.4 Sub-project of Hanover:

Negotiation of Belonging and Citizenship in Consideration of Social Categorisations.

The construction processes of cultural difference as well as the negotiation of *citizenship* and *belonging* in Latin America are also the central focus of the sub-projects of Hanover in **2014-2016**. The analysis of the interdependencies of social categorisations is still a central part. The sub-project Hanover investigates the entanglements of the categories class, age, *ethnicity* and gender in the context of migration processes and the construction of elites. The central question is how far *ethnicity* is becoming important for these entanglements at the action level of the actors. The sub-project Hanover, together with the sub-project Cologne, also works on an event on sensitising trainers for an anti-racist and postcolonial perspective on Global Education and Intercultural Coaching.

Moreover, increasing global entanglements make comparative perspectives regarding other regions of the world a further interesting focus of investigation. Existing contacts are used to achieve a more solid cooperation with researchers who work on issues in the context of Africa at the participating Universities of Cologne and Hanover.

In **2010-2014**, the focus of research has been *ethnicity* as a process of categorisation, which refers to cultural or phenotypic characteristics and is to be historically traced. With the concept of *belonging*, types of social organisation could be included in the analyses that are not based on ethnic characteristics. Within the framework of Hanover's research question, ethnic adscriptions were primarily analysed in their interaction with socioeconomic and political changes. In doing so, ethnic collectives were not assumed to be homogeneous. In fact, their internal conflicts and perceived differences, which depend on gender, generation and class relations, build a central focus of the research.



2.5 Sub-project Münster:Ethnic Differentiation in the MexicanNation-building Process

This sub-project investigates the historical formation of *citizenship* in Mexico in the early 19th century considering the ethnic and national categorisations of *belonging* in the postcolonial state and nation building process. In **2014-2016**, the focus lies on the creation and application of ethnic and national categories of identity at the local level, to show their variability and contextuality. The project also aims at assembling results of the researchers of the Network in the form of radio features in Germany and Latin America.

In **2010-2014**, the main topic was the meaning of ethnic adscription for the development of *citizenship* in indigenous and Afro-American populations in Mexico since the late 18th century.

Dr. Floya Anthias (professor emeritus at Roehampton University, London) is a renowned investigator regarding the issues of *ethnicity*, "race", gender, class, intersectionality, migration, *global citizenship* and especially *belonging*. During her stay in 2013 she gave important input for the development of the theoretical concepts and open the view for a supraregional perspective due to her intensive engagement regarding the central concepts of the Research Network focusing on Europe.

Dr. Christine Hünefeldt (professor at the University of San Diego) is an anthropologist and historian with special focus on *ethnicity* and gender in the Andean region. Thanks to her stay in 2013, the members of the Research Network were introduced to new ideas regarding interdependencies and historiography of the theoretical concepts and were able to establish further contacts to the United States.

Dr. Mario Rufer (Argentinean professor at the Universidad Metropolitana in Mexico) has focused his investigation on nation and politics concerning the past in Argentina and South Africa, postcolonial theories and Subaltern Studies. He visited the Research Network in 2013, which gave way to the opportunity for an intensive exchange of ideas with a scientist from Latin America who also alluded to a supra-regional perspective.

Dr. Valeria Coronel (professor at FLACSO Quito, Ecuador) is Dean of the Faculty for Sociology and Gender Studies at FLACSO, Ecuador. She is Historian and Sociologist and investigates on class, *citizenship* and *ethnicity* in postcolonial contexts. Besides important input regarding research content, the cooperation with FLACSO was strengthened by her visit in 2015.

Dr. Natalia Molina (professor at the University of San Diego) is Historian with a special emphasis on *ethnicity*, gender and *citizenship* in Latin America and the USA. During her stay in 2015 members of the Research Network also received new ideas about interdependencies and historisation of the theoretical concepts in other regions of the world. The existing cooperation with the UC San Diego was also strengthened by Dr. Molina's visit.

Dr. Alejandro Grimson (professor at the Universidad Nacional de San Martín) is Anthropologist with emphasis on Nation, Identity, Migration and Ethnicity and visited the Research Network in Cologne for in 2015. Due to his research focus, he could give important inputs and allow a fruitful scientific exchange.
